Diether W. Beuermann is a Lead Economist in the Caribbean Country Department of the Inter-American Development Bank. He has led research and data collection projects in various countries, including Barbados, Guyana, Jamaica, Peru, Russia, Suriname, The Bahamas, Democratic Republic of Congo, Trinidad and Tobago, and the United States.

His research has covered the effects of different information and communication technologies on agricultural profitability, child labour, academic performance, pre-natal care, and neo-natal health. He has also conducted research on the effectiveness of participatory budgeting; the short- and long-run effects of educational quality; the role of remittances as a social insurance mechanism; the effects of early-life weather shocks on short- and long-term human capital accumulation; the effects of public health insurance on health outcomes and labour supply; the effects of behavioural-based entrepreneurship training on firm profitability; the effects of blue-collar crime on financial access and credit prices of affected firms; and the effectiveness of math-focused parenting programmes.

He has published in several international peer-reviewed journals, including the *American Economic Journal: Applied Economics*, *Journal of Human Resources*, *Journal of Health Economics*, *Journal of Development Economics*, *Economics of Governance*, and *Economics and Human Biology*.

He holds a BA in Business Management and a BSc in Economics from the Universidad de Lima, a MSc in Finance from the University of Durham, and a MA and PhD in Economics from the University of Maryland-College Park.
